**GENERAL SAFETY AND HEALTH PROTOCOL FOR STUDENTS
DURING FACE-TO-FACE CLASSES SY 2022-2023**

1. Students shall proceed to their designated entrance gate, check their body temperature, scan their school ID, and disinfect their hands.

Entrance and Exit Gates

2. In any case that a student’s body temperature is above the normal range ($36.5^{\circ}\text{C} - 37.5^{\circ}\text{C}$), he/she will be directed to proceed to the isolation area identified by the clinic staff.
 - The student will be brought to the designated isolation area.
 - Medical Management will be done.
 - Assessment shall be done by rechecking the temperature, acquiring, and recording health-related data.
 - The clinic personnel shall call the parent/guardian for confirmation of the health-related data gathered from the student and inquire about the drug/medicine to be administered to the student.
 - The clinic personnel shall administer antipyretic medicine to the student/patient.
 - If the student is advised to rest at home, a permission slip to go home is signed by the attending physician/nurse and countersigned by the assistant principal (*or by the assigned representative*).
 - Then, the student’s parent/guardian is informed to pick him/her up at the clinic.
 - In case of an emergency or whenever hospitalization is necessary, the student is brought to the nearest hospital. The parents are immediately notified.
3. After observing the health screening at the gate, students shall directly proceed to their assigned classrooms.
4. All students are required to wear face masks properly except when eating and drinking.

5. Students should follow the markers when walking along the corridors and stairways; keep right and avoid counter-flow.
6. Before entering the classroom, students must disinfect their hands and then proceed to their assigned seat.
7. In using the comfort rooms, the teacher shall permit one (1) student at a time to take the CR break.
8. During meal breaks, students must stay in the designated areas and keep in mind to always clean and sanitize their area before and after use.
9. Proper distance shall be maintained between individuals at all times.
10. Students must immediately report to their teacher if they start to feel unwell while inside the campus; and they will be directed to the school clinic for immediate attention, following the same step-by-step health protocols.
11. Once dismissed, students must take precautions when they proceed to the exit gates and take their rides.
12. If students were not able to come to school because of health reasons especially if positive for Covid-19, the parents/guardians are required to report it to the school clinic. A medical certificate shall be submitted via MS Teams before coming to school, and a final clearance shall be provided by the Clinic personnel, to be presented to the homeroom adviser.
13. Students may return to school only after 24 hours of being afebrile (not having a fever) or asymptomatic without the use of antipyretic medicines and have undergone the recommended number of days of isolation or quarantine (*according to DOH/IATF guidelines on quarantine and isolation*).
14. Class suspension shall be declared when alert level 3 is declared by the IATF and when there is a suspect, probable, or confirmed case of covid-19 among the students or school personnel. The following guidelines shall be followed:
 - Contact tracing shall be done accordingly.
 - Disinfection of involved places inside the school shall follow when contact tracing is completed.
 - Classes may resume after at least 24 hours since suspension and upon ensuring the following
 - a. completed contact tracing
 - b. completed disinfection activities
 - c. existing alert level 1 or 2 in the locality

TABLE FOR ISOLATION AND QUARANTINE

PATIENT CASE	VACCINATION STATUS	GENERAL PUBLIC
ISOLATION		
POSITIVE – Asymptomatic Case (No symptoms)	Fully vaccinated	at least 7 days from positive test
	Partially vaccinated or Unvaccinated	at least 10 days from positive test
Symptomatic, suspect PROBABLE Case OR POSITIVE Mild case	Fully vaccinated	at least 7 days from onset of symptoms
	Partially vaccinated or Unvaccinated	at least 10 days from onset of symptoms
Symptomatic, suspect POSITIVE Moderate Case	Regardless of vaccination status	at least 10 days from onset of symptoms
POSITIVE Severe Case	Regardless of vaccination status	21 days from the onset of symptoms
POSITIVE Immunocompromised (Autoimmune disease, HIV, Cancer Malignancy, Transplant patients, Patients with poor prognosis/ Bedridden patients)	Regardless of vaccination status	21 days from the onset of symptoms with negative repeat RT/PCR test
QUARANTINE		
For asymptomatic (No symptoms) CLOSE CONTACTS	Fully vaccinated	0 days from exposure
	Partially vaccinated or unvaccinated	14 days from exposure

Fully vaccinated is someone who completed 2 doses and the 2nd dose was administered more than two weeks already.

Partially vaccinated is someone who has not completed the 2 doses, or his 2nd dose was just administered less than two weeks.
